Why Project Integra has been awarded Beacon Council status

The Project Integra partnership was formed in 1995 following the award of a 25 year waste management service contract to Hampshire Waste Services Ltd. The partnership between the local authorities is underpinned by a memorandum of understanding, income share agreement and by joint service planning.

Since the introduction of the partnership, Hampshire has seen dramatic results and many achievements, such as those on the cover of this leaflet.

At the end of 1999, the Department of the Environment, Transport and the Regions (DETR) awarded Project Integra Beacon Council status for sustainable development in dealing with waste.

Beacon Councils represent some of the best in local government, leading the way in particular areas of activity that make a real difference to the quality of the lives of local people and to the community as a whole. Beacon status is awarded so that others can benefit from the experience of those councils which have excellence to share.

During their time as Beacons, councils are obliged to undertake a variety of activities to spread their best practice to others, including offering work shadowing placements and hosting open days.

Why you should attend Open Day 2

Integra's first open day - *The development of Project Integra, its achievements and challenges* in Southampton on 23 May - was a big success, attended by 160 delegates from all over the UK. We expect demand to be high for the 150 places at Open Day 2, so **book now** to secure your place.

Our second Beacon open day is at The Harlington Centre in Fleet on 18 October 2000. Its theme will be ***Locking waste management into sustainable and economic development***, concentrating on waste as a resource. The aim is to focus on the recovery of material resources from the current waste stream and consider the implications for 'closing the loop'. This will include delegate-led discussion groups and workshops, aimed at:

- local government waste management officers
- economic development officers
- chief executives
- strategy and policy officers
- industrialists
- community businesses.

This interactive working with key people from all sectors involved in waste and recycling offers a real learning opportunity for all delegates.

Representatives have been invited from organisations such as: Waste Watch, Friends of the Earth, WRAP (Waste and Resources Action Programme), The Environment Agency, Government and various organisations from the materials reprocessing industry.

A plenary feedback session in the afternoon should clarify ideas, aims and objectives to take away and work on within your own local environment. Outcomes will be posted on the Integra web site as soon as possible after the event.

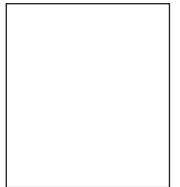
